\*If the voter does not present photo ID, she may sign an affidavit and vote a regular ballot.

\*\*ID requirement waived if the driver's license or Social Security numbers are matched to a federal database.

<sup>1</sup> If a photo ID without signature is presented, the voter may present an additional ID with signature.

<sup>2</sup> If the voter does not present photo ID and signs an affidavit, she is subject to vote challenges.

<sup>3</sup> The Missouri Supreme Court affirmed an order striking down the state's voter ID statute in October 2006.

<sup>4</sup> HAVA requires first-time registrants who register by mail to provide proof of identity. A broad range of documents may be used to establish identity. The identification requirement is waived if the state can match the applicants to information in another government database, typically Social Security or the state's motor vehicle database.
