



# NONPROFIT VOTE STATE FACT SHEET OKLAHOMA



## VOTER FAQs:

### WHAT SHOULD I KNOW TO BE REGISTERED TO VOTE?

- **How Old Do I Need to Be?** 17 1/2 can pre-register but cannot vote until 18 and application is approved
- **Can I Register Online?** You can fill out a Voter Registration Application using the OK Voter Portal “wizard” and then print, sign, and submit the application to your County Election Board
- **I Have a Felony Record, Can I Still Register?** You may register or re-register to vote after the completion of the original sentence
- **I Am Homeless, How Do I Register?** List a shelter address or where you sleep most often, like a street corner or park address
- **Where Do I Register in Person?** At your County Election Board, most tag agencies, post offices, and libraries
- **Is there a residency requirement?** You must be an Oklahoma resident
- **Do I need ID to register in-person?** Yes, you must have an Oklahoma Driver’s License, State ID, or the last four of your social security number.

### WHAT SHOULD I KNOW ABOUT VOTING IN-PERSON?

- **Do I Need ID to Vote?** Yes, you need a valid photo ID, otherwise you can vote with a provisional ballot
- **When Can I Vote?** See the Important Dates.
- **Where Can I Find My Polling Place?** See the State Voter Portal
- **I Have a Disability, Are Polling Places Accessible to Me?** Yes, polling places are accessible and you can request assistance. Accessible voting equipment is also available.

### WHAT SHOULD I KNOW ABOUT VOTING BY MAIL?

- **Who Can Vote By Mail?** Any registered voter, but you must have your absentee ballot notarized by a Notary Public
- **How Do I Apply for a Vote By Mail Ballot?** Apply online or submit an application by mail (postage required), email, fax, or delivery in person
- **How Do I Return My Ballot?** After placing your voted ballot inside the Affidavit envelope and filling it out completely, seal it inside the Return envelope and hand-delivered or mail it (postage required) to the County Election Board
- **When is My Ballot Due?** Postmarked or hand delivered no later than 7pm election day
- **How Do I Track My Ballot?** See State Voter Portal
- **I Have a Disability, Can I Use Assistance?** Yes, you may request assistance or provide a specific physical disability to take advantage of special conditions that may make absentee voting easier



### IMPORTANT DATES

*Early Voting Period:* Nov 3 - 5

*Election date:* Nov 8

*Registration deadline:* Oct 14

*Vote by Mail request deadline:* Oct 24
