

NONPROFIT VOTE STATE FACT SHEET

COLORADO



VOTER FAQs:

WHAT SHOULD I KNOW TO BE REGISTERED TO VOTE?

- **How Old Do I Need to Be?** 16 years old but you need to be 18 years old to vote
- **Can I Register Online?** Yes, you will need your SSN or CO license or ID number
- **I Have a Felony Record, Can I Still Register?** Yes, as of 2019 in Colorado people on probation and parole with a felony conviction are eligible to register and vote
- **I Am Homeless, How Do I Register?** Use any address within a specific county that you regularly return to, such as a shelter, park, etc. and a separate mailing address
- **Where Do I Register in Person?** At your local board of elections office, DMV, offices that provide public assistance, or armed forces recruitment offices
- **Is there a residency requirement?** Yes, you must be resident of Colorado
- **Do I need ID to register in-person?** Yes, a valid CO license or ID card, passport, tribal ID, utility bill or bank statement from last 60 days, or a military, veteran, government employee, or medicare/medicaid card

WHAT SHOULD I KNOW ABOUT VOTING IN-PERSON?

- **Do I Need ID to Vote?** Yes, see "Voter ID Needs"
- **When Can I Vote?** See the Important Dates.
- **Where Can I Find My Polling Place?** See the State Voter Portal.
- **I Have a Disability, Are Polling Places Accessible to Me?**
Yes, voting locations are accessible. "Online voting" is also available 22 days before and through election day and return it by hand or electronically if you have certain disabilities

WHAT SHOULD I KNOW ABOUT VOTING BY MAIL?

- **Who Can Vote By Mail?** Any registered voter, no excuses needed
- **How Do I Apply for a Vote By Mail Ballot?** A mail ballot will be sent to you automatically. Check your registration status to make sure it is sent to the correct address.
- **How Do I Return My Ballot?** By mail (use two stamps!) or in-person drop off
- **When is My Ballot Due?** Received by 7pm on Election Day.
- **How Do I Track My Ballot?** You can sign up for <https://colorado.ballottrax.net>, a system that tracks your ballot from sent to accepted

Oct 24 - Nov 8

Election date: Nov 8

Registration deadline: N/A

Vote by Mail request deadline: Oct 31
