



NONPROFIT VOTE STATE FACT SHEET FLORIDA



VOTER FAQs:

WHAT SHOULD I KNOW TO BE REGISTERED TO VOTE?

- **How Old Do I Need to Be?** At least 18 years-old by Election day, 16 year-old to pre-register
- **Can I Register Online?** Yes, you will need your SSN and a FL driver's license or ID if you have one
- **I Have a Felony Record, Can I Still Register?** After completion of sentence, parole and possibly fees, people with a felony conviction (other than murder or sexual offense felonies) regain the right to register and vote
- **I Am Homeless, How Do I Register?** Use the address or cross streets for wherever you sleep... It may even be a specific street corner, park bench, vacant lot, etc., to where the person frequently rests or returns and intends to serve as the "home-base"
- **Is there a residency requirement?** Yes, you must be a resident of the state and the county/township for 21 days before you vote

WHAT SHOULD I KNOW ABOUT VOTING IN-PERSON?

- **Do I Need ID to Vote?** Yes, it must include a photo. Florida driver's license, Florida identification card, passport, Debit/credit card, Military or student identification
- **When Can I Vote?** See the Important Dates.
- **Where Can I Find My Polling Place?** See the State Voter Portal.
- **I Have a Disability, Are Polling Places Accessible to Me?** Yes, polling places are accessible and you can get assistance to vote

WHAT SHOULD I KNOW ABOUT VOTING BY MAIL?

- **Who Can Vote By Mail?** Any registered voter
- **How Do I Apply for a Vote By Mail Ballot?** Mail, email, fax, phone or in person
- **How Do I Return My Ballot?** By mail or in-person drop off at your elections office, a designated drop box, or at an early voting site
- **When is My Ballot Due?** Your marked ballot must be mailed or delivered in person, reaching the Supervisor of Elections' office not later than 7:00 pm on the day of the election. Do not return your voted mail ballot to a polling place.
- **How Do I Track My Ballot?** See the state voter portal
- **I Have a Disability, Can I Use Assistance?** Yes, you can designate someone to pick up a ballot but no earlier than nine days before Election Day



IMPORTANT DATES

Early Voting Period: Oct 29 - Nov 5

Election date: Nov 8

Registration deadline: Oct 11

Vote by Mail request deadline: Oct 28
