



# NONPROFIT VOTE STATE FACT SHEET

## MISSOURI



### VOTER FAQs:

#### WHAT SHOULD I KNOW TO BE REGISTERED TO VOTE?

- **How Old Do I Need to Be?** Be at least 17-1/2 years of age but you must be 18 to vote
- **Can I Register Online?** Yes, if you do not have state issued ID you can use the last four digits of your SSN
- **I Have a Felony Record, Can I Still Register?** Individuals convicted of a felony receive automatic restoration of their voting rights upon completion of their sentence, including probation or parole
- **I Am Homeless, How Do I Register?** Need a mailing address to receive an address verification card - address of homeless shelter or daycare center can be used
- **Where Do I Register in Person?** County Clerk's office or Department of Motor Vehicles (or any state agency providing service to the public)
- **Is there a residency requirement?** You must be a resident of Missouri

#### WHAT SHOULD I KNOW ABOUT VOTING IN-PERSON?

- **Do I Need ID to Vote?** Yes, a state issued ID, government ID, ID from an institution of higher education, or utility bill, paycheck or other document that contains the voter's address
- **When Can I Vote?** See Important Dates
- **Where Can I Find My Polling Place?** See the State Voter Portal
- **I Have a Disability, Are Polling Places Accessible to Me?**  
Yes, polling places are accessible, can change location if needed; curbside voting and accessible voting systems are available

#### WHAT SHOULD I KNOW ABOUT VOTING BY MAIL?

- **Who Can Vote By Mail?** Anyone that is absent on election day, ill or have a disability, someone who is responsible for physical care of a person with an illness or disability, employed as an election authority or by an election authority, or is incarcerated, provided voting rights are maintained
- **How Do I Apply for a Vote By Mail Ballot?** In-person or by mail
- **How Do I Return My Ballot?** Must be sent by mail after it has been notarized
- **When is My Ballot Due?** After completing the ballot, sign and date the outside envelope and mail or hand deliver it to your local election authority
- **I Have a Disability, Can I Use Assistance?** Yes, able to be placed on the permanent absentee voting list. A close relative can complete ballot on behalf of voter



#### IMPORTANT DATES

*Election date:* Nov 8

*Registration deadline:* Oct 12

*Vote by Mail request deadline:* Oct 26

*Early Voting Starts:* Oct 25
