

# **VOTER FAQS:**

#### WHAT SHOULD I KNOW TO BE REGISTERED TO VOTE?

- How Old Do I Need to Be? 18 years old by election day or if you are 16 or 17, you can sign up as a Future Voter and be automatically registered to vote when you qualify
- Can I Register Online? Yes, you'll need a Washington State Driver License or ID
- I Have a Felony Record, Can I Still Register? Yes, our right to vote will be restored automatically as long as you are not currently serving a sentence of total confinement in prison
- I Am Homeless, How Do I Register? You can fill in the address of a park, intersection, or another place that can be find on a map where you stay as your residential address and the mailing address of where you recieve mail
- Where Do I Register in Person? At your county elections office
- Is there a residency requirement? Yes, you must be a legal resident of Washington state for at least 30 days prior to election day
- Does WA offer same day registration? If yes, what do I need? Yes, you'll need
  a Washington State Driver License or ID and a proof of residency (e.g. utility bill)

#### WHAT SHOULD I KNOW ABOUT VOTING IN-PERSON?

- Do I Need ID to Vote? Yes, WA license, state ID, student ID, employee ID, tribal ID (If you don't have one, you can vote a provisional ballot which will be counted if the signature on it matches up with your signature on file)
- When Can I Vote? See the Important Dates.
- Where Can I Find My Polling Place? See the State Voter Portal.
- I Have a Disability, Are Polling Places Accessible to Me?
   Yes, accessible voting units are available starting 18 days before Election Day and voting centers must meet all of the ADA requirements

#### WHAT SHOULD I KNOW ABOUT VOTING BY MAIL?

- Who Can Vote By Mail? Any registered voter
- How Do I Apply for a Vote By Mail Ballot? All eligible voters are automatically sent a ballot at least 18 days before election
- How Do I Return My Ballot? By mail (pre-paid postage) or in person
- When is My Ballot Due? If mailed, must be postmarked by election day. Drop boxes are open until 8 p.m. on election day
- How Do I Track My Ballot? Same portal as Register to Vote Online
- I Have a Disability, Can I Use Assistance? Unspecified but some counties offer online ballot marking programs. Call county elections officials for more information
