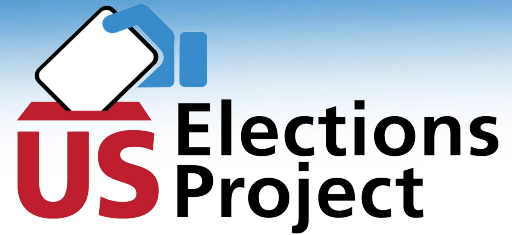

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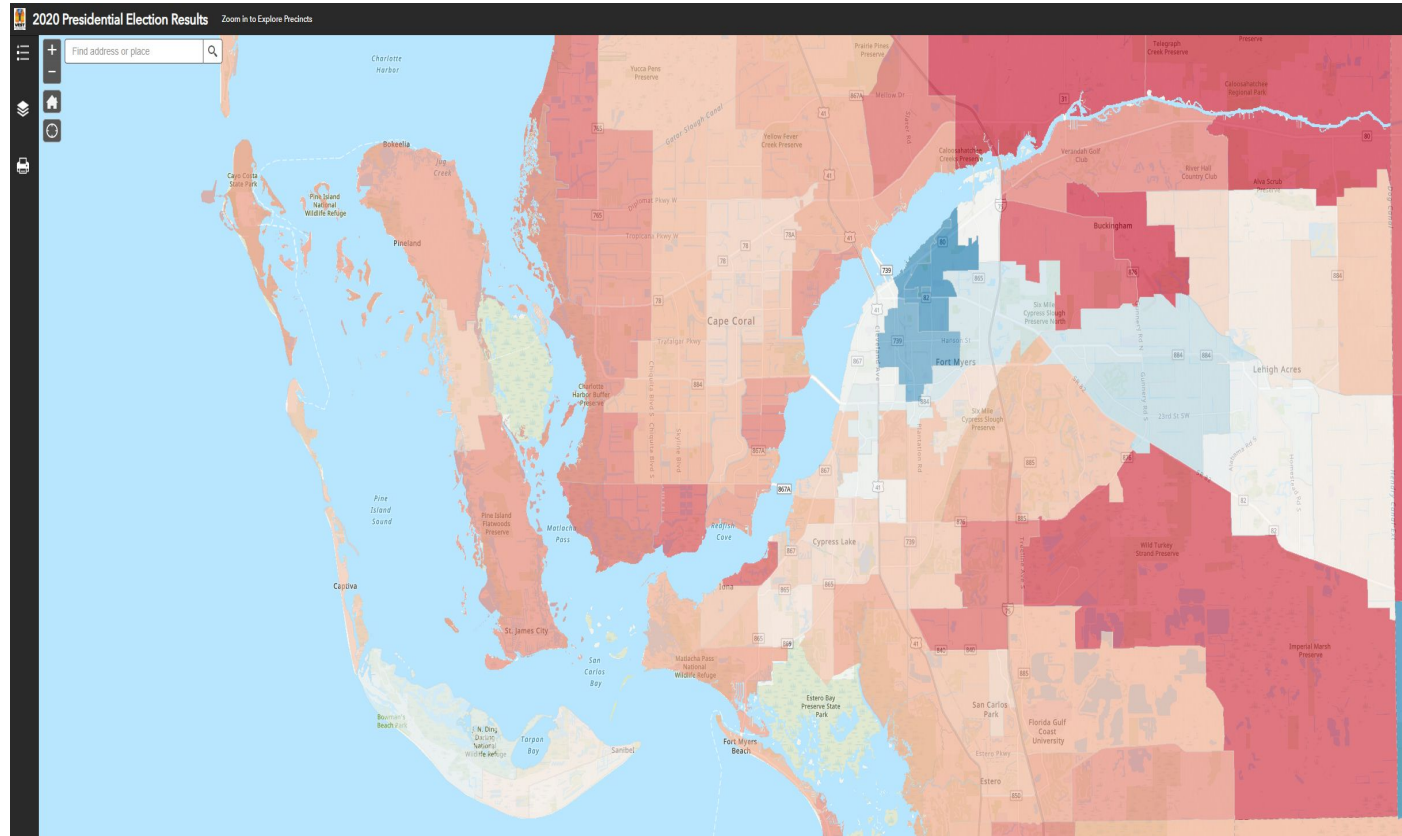

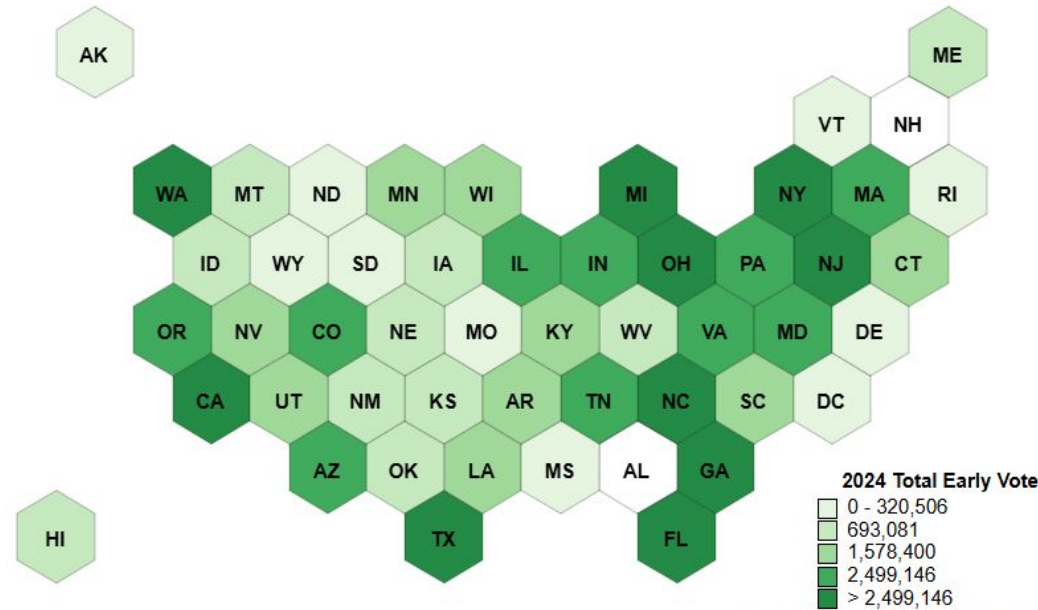

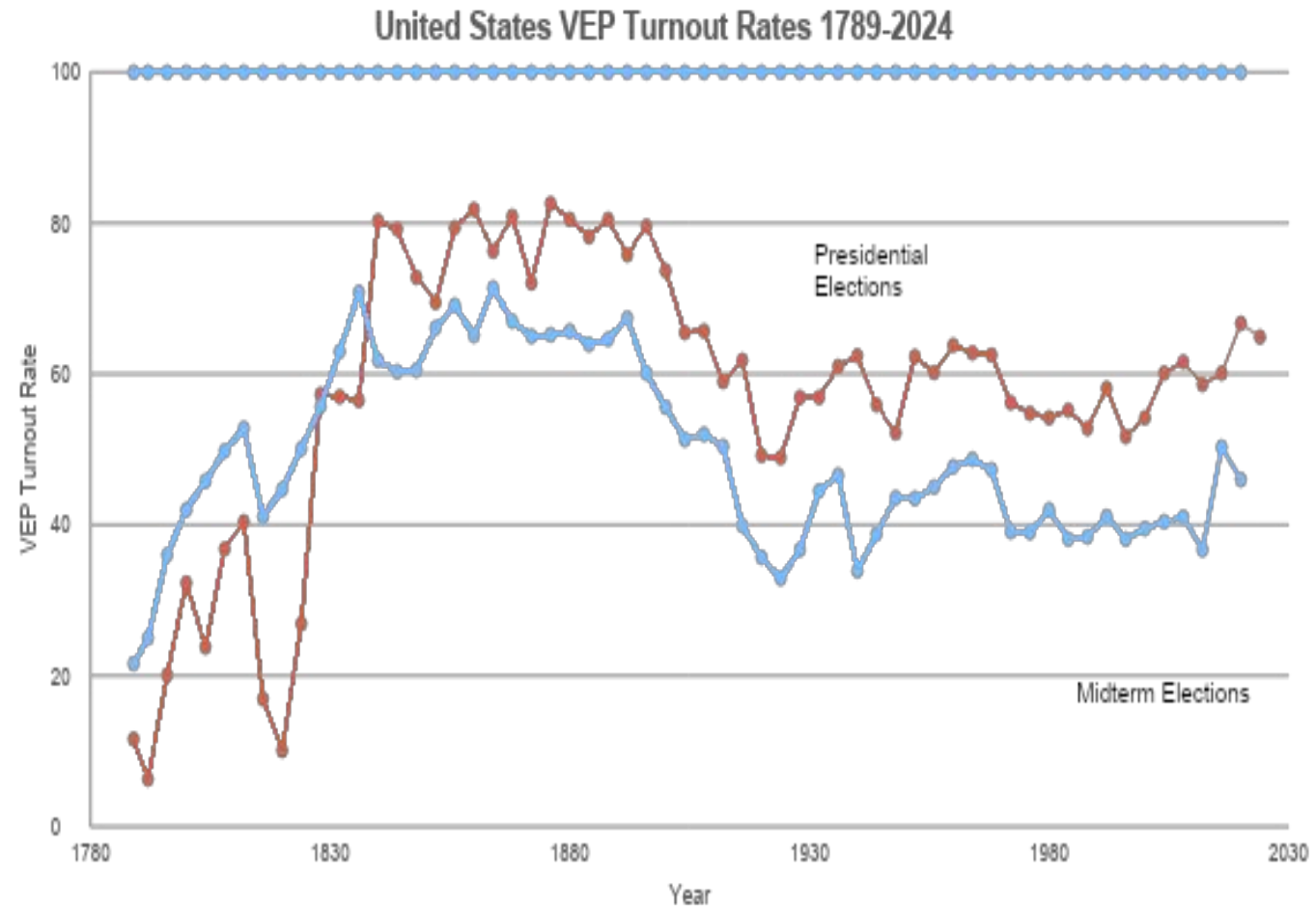
2024 Total Early Vote

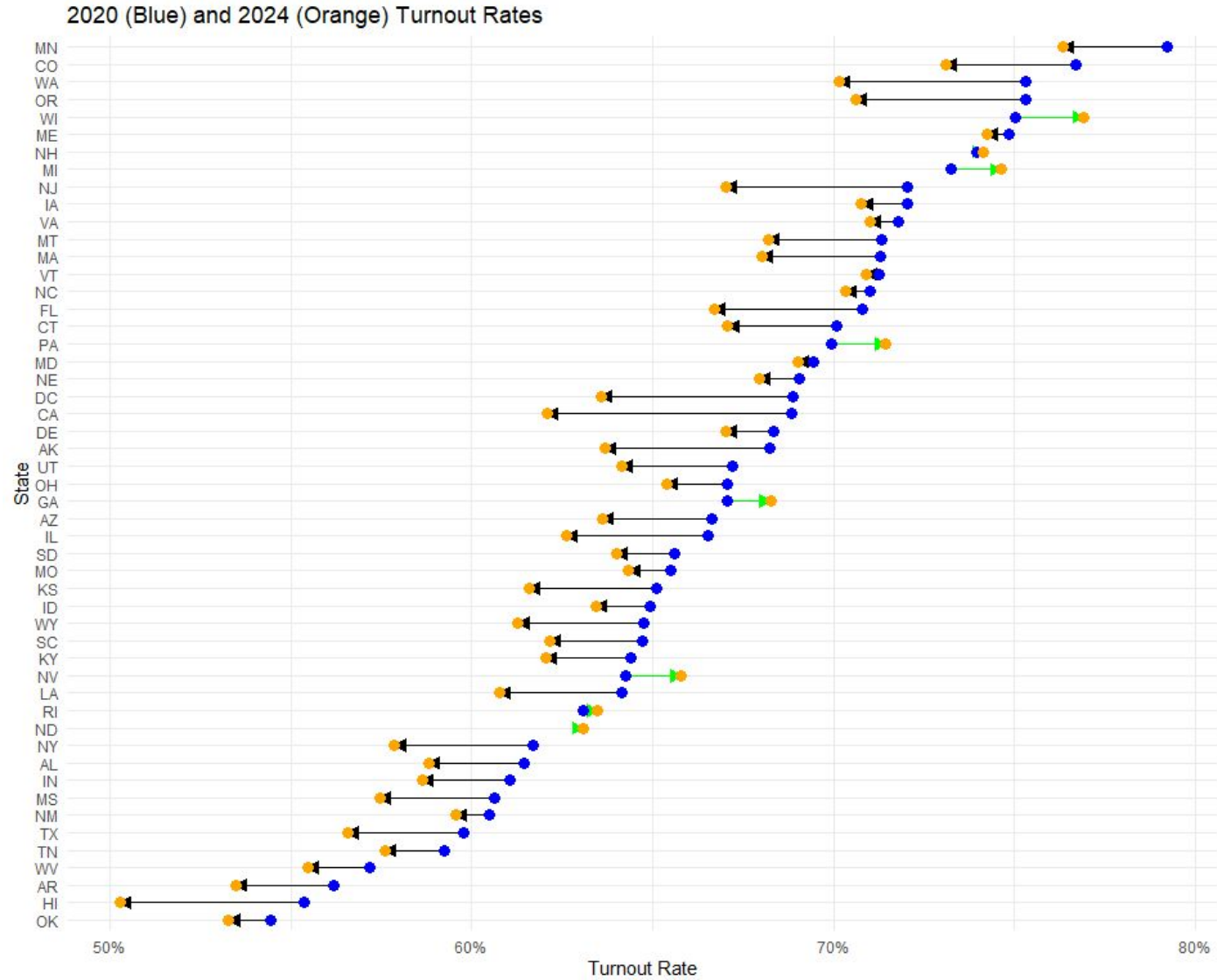

State Turnout Rates 2020 (Blue) vs. 2024 (Orange)

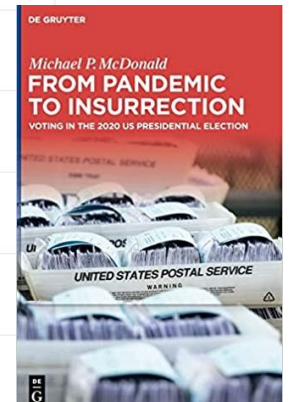
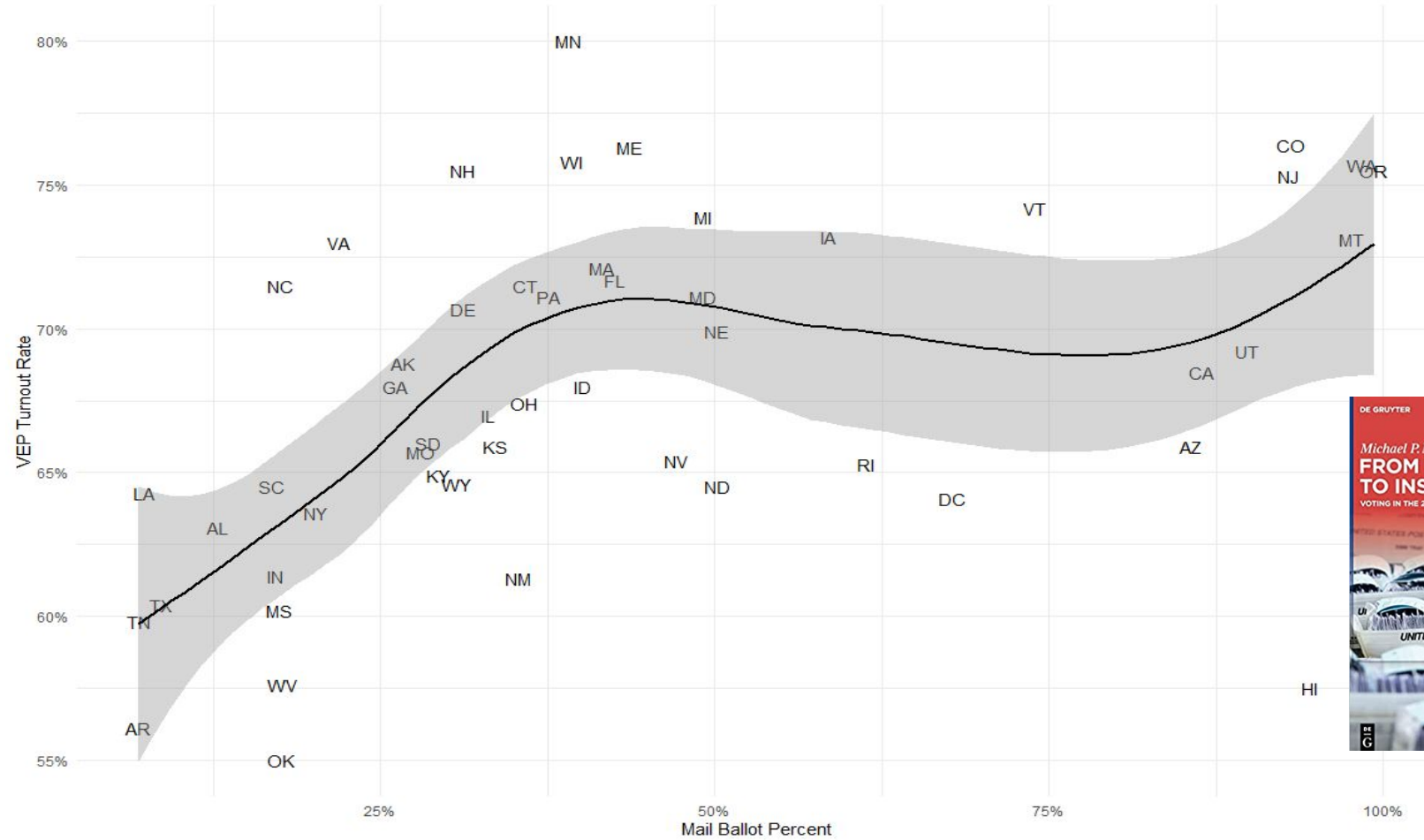

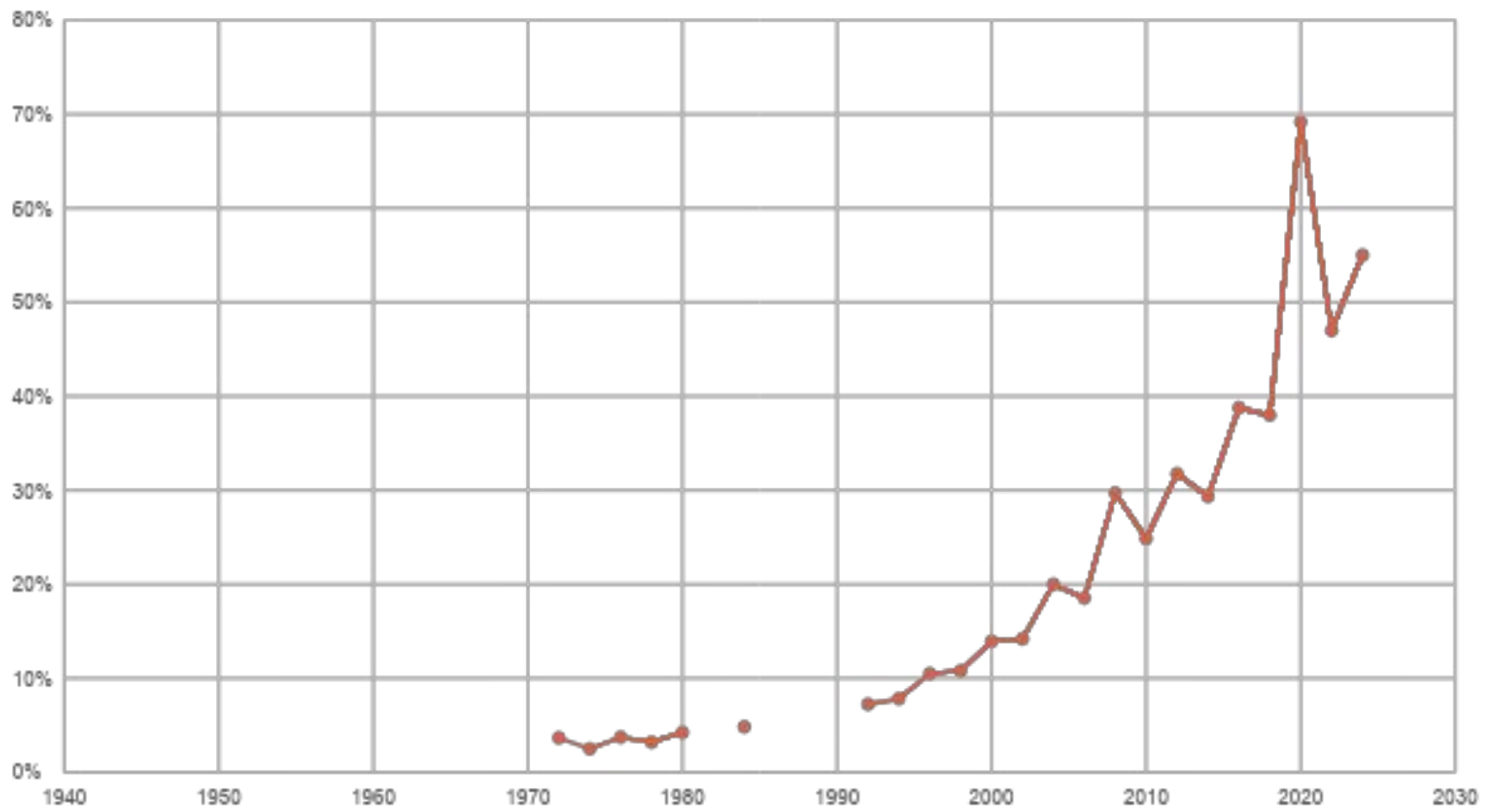

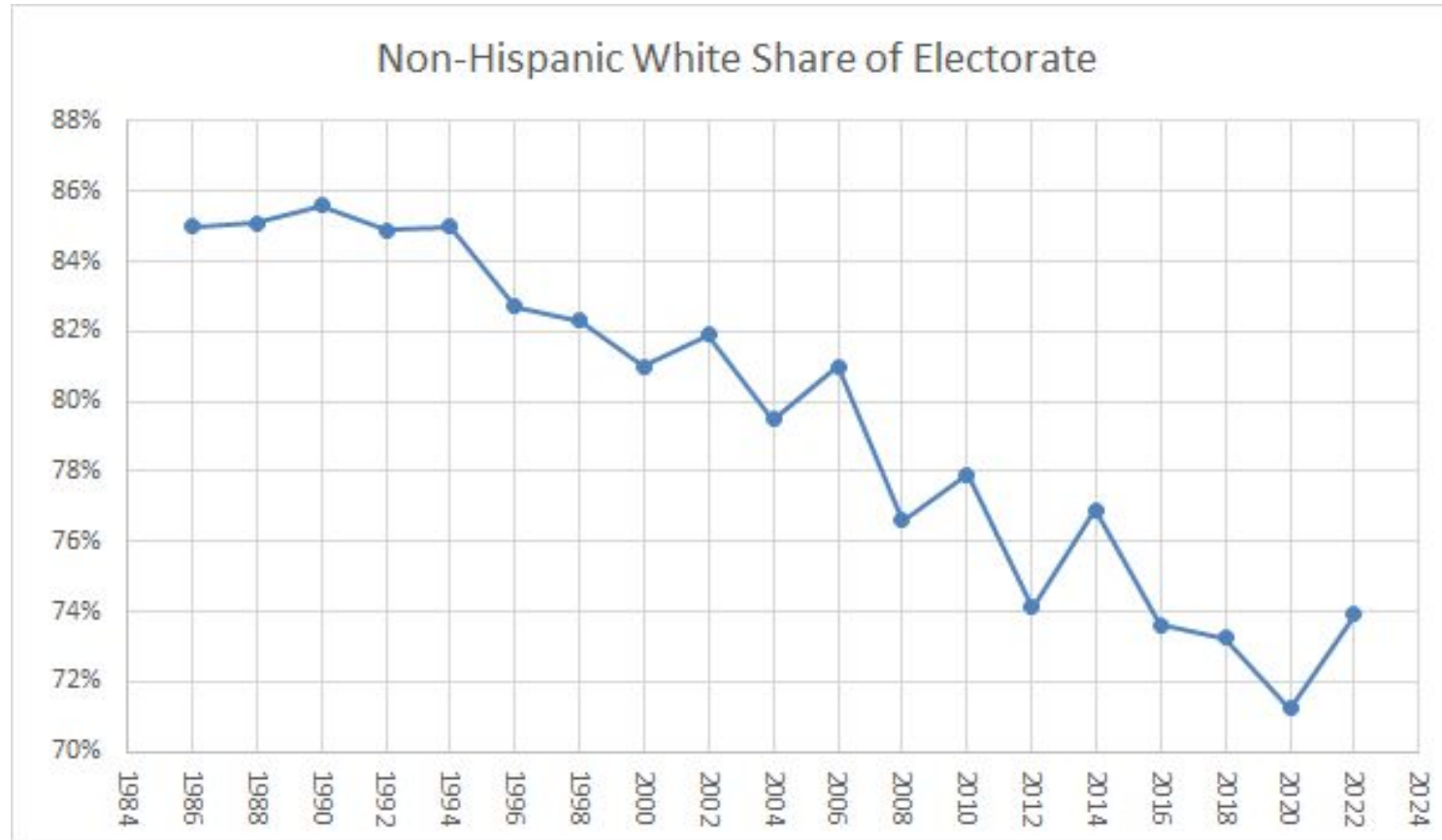
Georgia Transitions in Voting Modes (2020 → 2024)



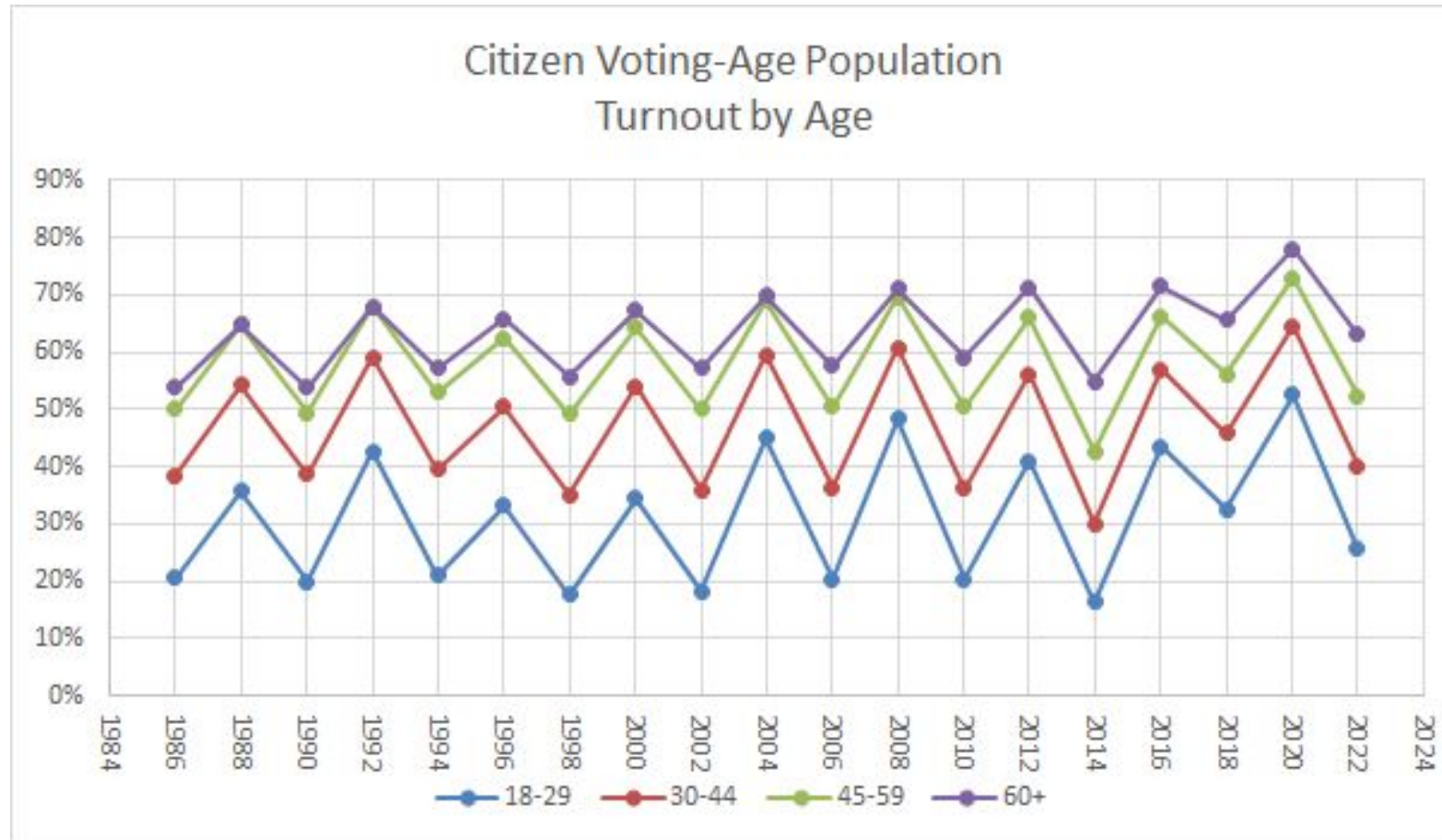
% Early Vote (Mail or In-Person Early)



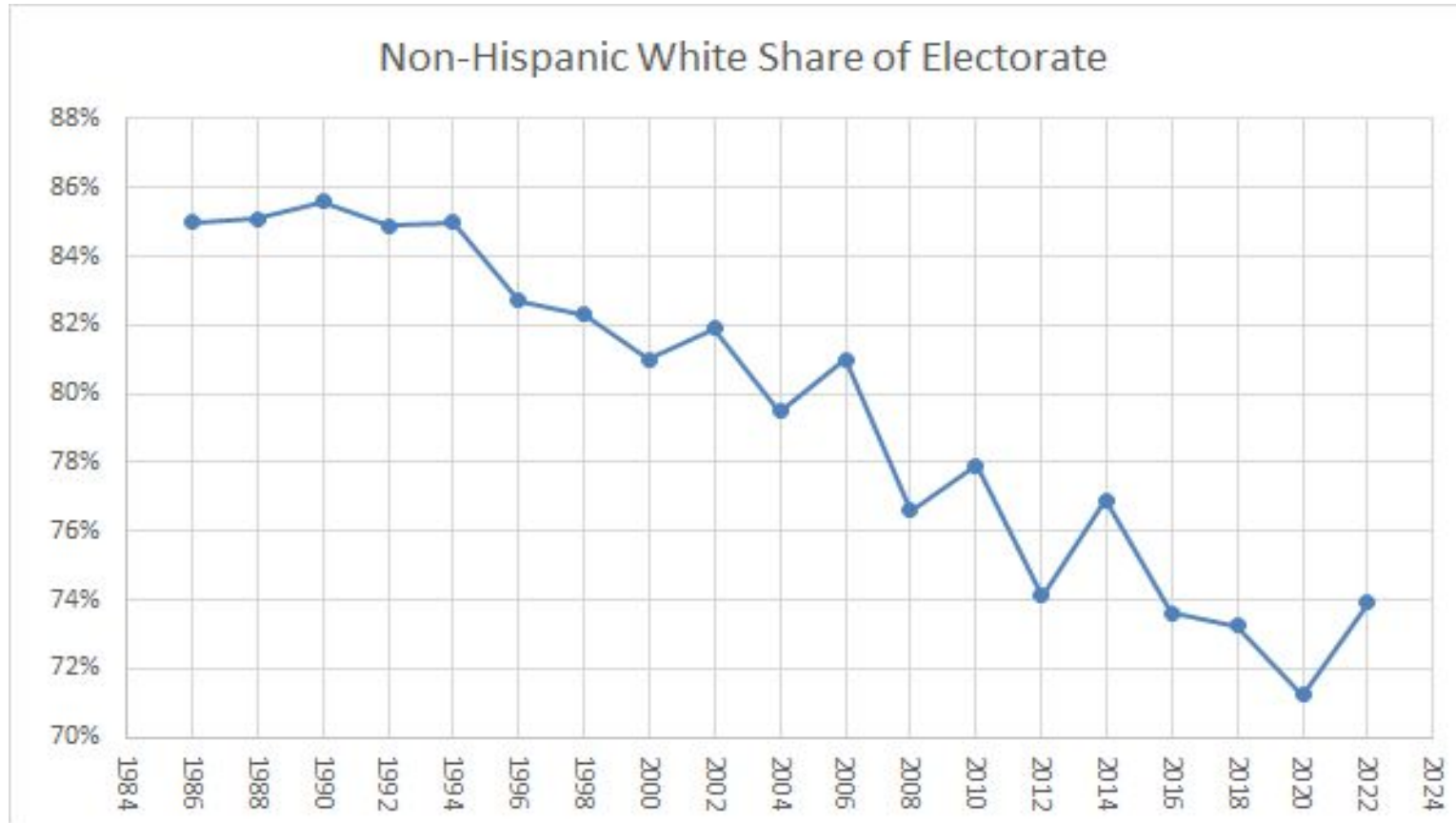
Race & Ethnicity Trend

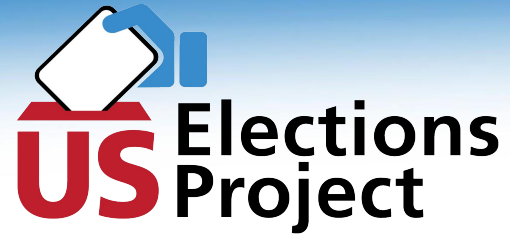


Age Trend
