

CONDUCTING A VOTER REGISTRATION DRIVE IN IDAHO



✓ VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINES

- Received by election officials by 11 days before Election Day.
- Idaho also allows voters to register in person during early voting or on Election Day.

GETTING STARTED

Training Requirement: Idaho does not require training for registration drives.

Notification and Registration Requirements: Idaho does not have notification requirements for registration drives.

Compensation Restrictions: Do not pay registration drive participants based on how many registrations they collect. Do not offer an applicant any incentive of monetary value to register to vote.

OBTAINING APPLICATIONS

State Form: The state mail-in voter registration application can be obtained at the county elections office or downloaded from the Secretary of State's Vote Idaho website at voteidaho.gov/voter-registration/

Federal Form: The federal mail-in voter registration application may be used in Idaho registration drives:

Photocopying Blank Forms: Blank applications may be photocopied and used in voter registration drives.

HANDLING APPLICATIONS

Documents Required: Paper applications collected at a drive must include copies of a current photo ID and proof of residency. A list of approved documents can be found on the voter registration form itself, and online at voteidaho.gov/voter-registration/. Proof of identification and residency can be satisfied by the following documents:

Identification

- Current Idaho driver's license or ID card;
- Current passport or other ID issued by the federal government;
- Current tribal identification card; or
- Current Idaho concealed carry permit.

Residency

- Any form of photo ID listed above that contains your current residential address;
- Deed, trust, mortgage, rental or lease agreement;
- Current proof of insurance;
- Property tax assessment, bill, or receipt;
- Intake document to a care facility;
- Utility bill (excluding cell phone);
- Bank or credit card statement;
- Paystub or paycheck; or
- Enrollment papers from a high school or accredited postsecondary institution in Idaho for the current year.

Incomplete Applications: Do not fill in any missing information on a registration form unless you have express consent from the applicant.

Photocopying Completed Applications: As a best practice, a voter's full or partial Social Security number and/or driver's license number should not be retained.

Submitting Completed Applications: Completed applications and copies of approved photo identification and proof of residency must be received by the county elections office of the applicant's county of residence by 11 days before Election Day. County elections offices information can be found on the voter registration application or voteidaho.gov/county-clerk/
